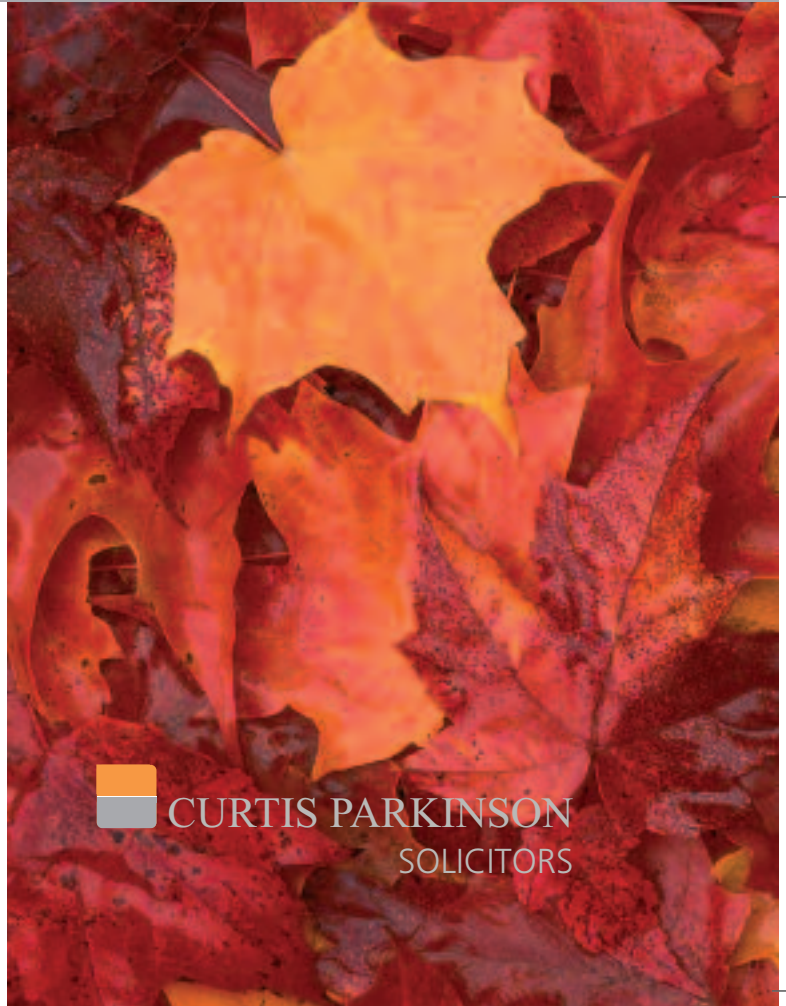

WHY MAKE A WILL?

It means you decide who receives your money, property and possessions when you die.

In your Will you can have your say in who looks after your children when they are under 18.

WHY HAPPENS IF I DIE WITHOUT A WILL?

If you die without a Will you have no control over who receives your money, property and possessions. This can mean that:

- Your spouse receives only a small amount of your assets
- Children/Grandchildren receive assets on terms you might not like
- You cannot leave gifts to non-blood relatives, friends or partners you live with.
- Your wealth may be seriously damaged by tax and extra costs.
- You are not looking after your children if they are under 18 when you die.

Don't wait to prepare a Will. It is a common mistake to leave making a Will until retirement. A Will should be prepared as early as possible as no one knows what's around the corner.

A Will is not just restricted to dealing with your money, property and possessions, you can use your Will to specify your particular wishes in respect of your funeral. For example whether you want your body to be buried or cremated. You can also state whether you are willing for your body to be used for therapeutic use or medical research after your death.
